Sunday Morning Services

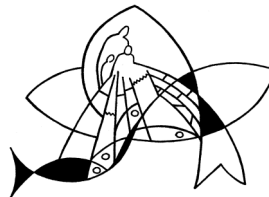
9:00 a.m.

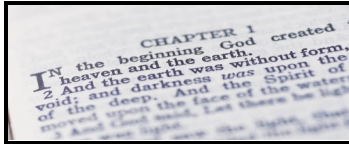

C.I.H.U. Class – C.I.H.U. means “Can I Help You?”. We are the Seniors of St. Luke but we welcome anyone, any age, who would be comfortable with us. The class engages in a variety of studies each year, including Lenten and Advent lessons, Bible Studies, Contemporary Social issues as related to Christian Faith, and personal faith concerns.
